6.0 Police Matters

PC Ian Ellis, deputising for Sgt. N Anderson. Safer neighbourhood is being considered to be extended north to Ruislip Manor. This would only be done by having additional officers otherwise staff would be spread too thinly.

Current issues. Goals Football is being used as a kids meeting area, and parking on Victoria Road is a problem. The police team is active on Friday nights to prevent anti social behaviour. The police has suggested more parking provision.

Queensmead School graffiti. PCSO now around the school, in alleyways. Gating of alleyways also being considered.

ASBO. Ongoing graffiti, six further ASBOs being pursued. Magistrates are letting off offenders lightly when brought before court.

Gangs of kids, especially in Field End Road. Three arrested for theft. ASBO being prepared. Parents are being fined in cases of juvenile crime.

Graffiti being addressed. Cannot give details of operation. Shops being tackled to stop paints and marker pens being sold.

Security watch with RAF Northolt police to start next month to liaise with safer neighbourhood group.

Bus stops, JC Decaux not interested in tackling broken glass.

Mini motor bike. Riders being stopped with '59' notice. If caught again in a year the bike can be destroyed.

Ickenham Marshes. Hillingdon trail being churned up. Problems in getting reply on the mobile number. People should phone Uxbridge police or 999 if no response on mobile number. Suggest recorded message when mobile phone is not in use.

Operation clean sweep. Total of 147 stops and 19 arrests. Another planned in a couple of weeks.

No applications made in our area yet, but all must apply for a licence before August.

8.0 Oliver Curley questions

Regarding the fence between The Croft and Victoria Road. Fence replaces around substation but fence along West Mead service road needs to be done as well. Mrs Wilson, 14 The Croft.

9.4 Transport Report

New bus U1. 4 route surveys have been carried out. Survey abandoned after protest and problems. Operational concerns, especially buses passing. We are awaiting response from TFL.

Parking outside VW garage. SRRA requested restricting be put on hold until VW garage up and running. Meeting next month, to be reported. Expect double yellow lines, at least on bend of road.

Request for control at junctions of Queens Walk and Long Drive. Suggestion of stop sign, but not allowed by regulations. Yellow lines are also a possibility.

Consultation notices to be put up on the junctions. Get in contact with David Seaman and the council.

Changes at The Polish Memorial roundabout. There has been 51 accidents and by law TFL had to make improvements to make the junction safer.

Local Development Framework comments made. The Government want more houses, SRRA requested a restriction on over development in South Ruislip.

SRRA objected to sighting of mobile phone masts.

The application for a care home on the site of the 'Tally Ho!' has gone to public inquiry. Do not know when yet.

Tesco Public Inquiry is due in march 2006.
